## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. What do you think of when you hear the term "proud father"? What are some characteristics that come to mind?
- 2. Why do we seek the approval of our fathers?
- 3. What do you wish you had heard from your dad?

  Leader Tip: Tailor this question to the group depending on their relationships with their dads.

  If they have personally received affirmation from their dads, ask how they've seen the lack of fatherly encouragement affect the lives of friends, people they know, etc.
- 4. Regardless of your relationship with your earthly father, you can receive a blessing from your Heavenly Father. What does it look like to "stop striving for the blessing" and to "start living from the blessing?"
- 5. How can you pass this affirmation and encouragement onto the next generation?
