INTRODUCTION

- 4. Do you have a friend who's experiencing one of the "3 Little Nots": 1.) *NOT* in church. 2.) *NOT* prepared for a new season of life. 3.) Or life is *NOT* going well. What would it take for you to invite them to this church this Sunday?
- 5. Andy said that "you need to create and commit to a plan to support your church financially." You're not alone if this is a scary challenge, but why is that perhaps so difficult to do? What is the biggest obstacle? And what might a financial plan to support the church you love look like for you?
- 6. Did you have an opportunity to fill out of the strategic service cards Sunday? In what area(s) are you considering serving at Athens Church in the fall? Why do you think Andy placed such emphasis on this request?
